Phonics & Spelling

We were pleased that many of you were able to join us for our spelling & phonics session with Emma Adcock. It is important that we build on the good phonics work the children have done in key stage 1 and support the children further with their phonics if they need it. Children who are confident with their phonics will be able to use their knowledge to help them read more challenging texts and to help them develop their spelling knowledge. For example, in the spelling work covered over a two week unit, the children look at the break down of the spellings using dots and dashes (their understanding of phonemes, graphemes and diagraphs).

Emma's presentation will be emailed out to all parents. If you have any questions about phonics or spelling, please do get in touch as we are really keen to support parents with an understanding of this area of learning.
