

- Longhouses Long, narrow houses lived in by the Vikings.
- Outlawed Having I your property taken away and not being allowed to live in a community.
- Pagans A religion where many Gods and Goddesses were worshiped.
- Pillaged To violently steal something..
- Raid A surprise attack
- Sagas stories told by Vikings.
- Punishments Brutal telling off.





Important facts

- The Vikings came from the modern Scandinavian countries of Norway, Sweden and Denmark.
- They travelled in boats called longships.
- They first arrived in Britain around AD 787.
- The Vikings raided places such as monasteries and pillaged expense items to trade.
- They were always looking for expensive goods like gold and jewels, imported foods and other useful materials.
- The Vikings wanted to claim lots of land and wanted to take over Britain.
- They invaded and settled in Scotland before heading south to invade York.
- By AD 878 Vikings had settled in Britain.
- Vikings lived on farms and kept cows, pigs and sheep for meat, wool and milk.
- The Kings of Anglo-Saxon Britain each ruled their out Kingdom.
- Wessex was the last Kingdom to become occupied by the Vikings.
